



1. RIVER AQUARIUM
www.acuariodezaragoza.com
Is the largest in Europe and one of the largest in the world with 70 fish tanks house and more than 5,000 animals.

2. WATER TOWER
www.legadoexpo Zaragoza.com
Symbol of the 2008 Zaragoza Expo, with 76 metres high, it represents an enormous drop of water falling onto a surface.

3. "EL ALMA DEL EBRO"

Impressive sculpture of Jaime Plensa located in front of the Palacio de Congresos. (12 m high by 7.5 m wide).

4. BRIDGE PAVILION

This was one of the exhibition pavilions of Expo Zaragoza 2008. Designed by the prestigious architect, Zaha Hadid.

5. PASARELA DEL VOLUNTARIADO

Pedestrian walkway, designed by Javier Manterola, connects the two banks of the Ebro, downstream from the site where the 2008 International Exhibition was located.



6. ALJAFERÍA PALACE
Mudéjar declared a World Heritage Site

This is one of the most important monuments of 11th century Hispano-Muslim architecture. The Patio de Santa Isabel, the Salón Dorado, the Oratorio and the Torre del Trovador stand out.

7. FECETAS CHURCH

S. XVII. The baroque decorations in plaster stand out with geometric motifs of the Mudéjar tradition that cover all its vaults.

8. SAN PABLO CHURCH
Mudéjar declared a World Heritage Site

On the outside is its slender tower or bell tower with its octagonal ground plan and on the inside, the Altarpiece, by Damián Forment (16th century).



9. CENTRAL MARKET

1903. Iron and glass were used in its construction, resulting in a building where tradition and modernity merge.

10. CAESARAUGUSTA WALLS

Nearly 80 metres long, this is the largest vestige conserved of this wall, constructed in the 3rd century.

11. JUDA TOWER

The Juda or Azuda, the headquarters of the Moslem governors, was raised on one of the towers of the Roman wall.

12. SAN JUAN DE LOS PANETES CHURCH

Baroque-style Catholic temple, its Mudéjar leaning tower stands out.



36. ROYAL SEMINARY OF SAN CARLOS

S. XVI. The church of the Immaculate stands out, one of the most spectacular and best preserved ensembles of the Spanish Baroque today.

37. LA MAGDALENA CHURCH

S. XIV. Mudéjar church with baroque reform work.

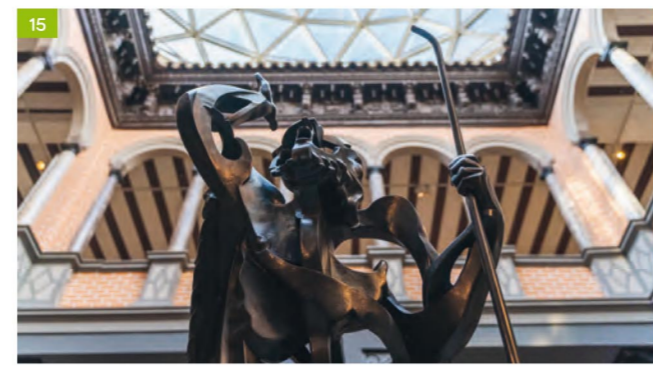
38. RESURRECTION MONASTERY
www.santo-sepulcro.com
S. XIV. The only mudéjar-style convent structure that has arrived complete and in operation to this day.

39. EMOZ ORIGAMI MUSEUM/SCHOOL - HISTORIES CENTER

It's the first museum dedicated to the art of origami in Europe. Located in the Centro de Historias.

40. SAN MIGUEL DE LOS NAVARROS CHURCH

S. XIV. Mudéjar building with later Baroque reform.

41. ZARAGOZA MUSEUM

S. XX. Its funds include the Archeology Sections, from Prehistory to the Muslim era, and Fine Arts, with works by Goya.

42. SANTA ENGRACIA BASILICA

Plateresque portal and crypt, in which two paleo-christian sarcophagi from the 4th century are kept.



13. SANTA ISABEL DE PORTUGAL CHURCH

1681. The structure imitates Italian Baroque Temples. Interesting redoses are preserved on the inside, the majority of which are Baroque.

14. TORREÓN FORTEA

Small Gothic-Mudéjar style tower from the 15th century, located in the Plaza de San Felipe.

15. PABLO GARGALLO MUSEUM

A monographic museum dedicated to the work of the Aragonese sculptor, Pablo Gargallo. Installed in the Argillo Palace (17th century). It was declared a national monument in 1943.

16. S. FELIPE Y SANTIAGO EL MENOR CHURCH

Baroque and neoclassicist style, it is located in one of the most charming squares in the city.

17. PALACE OF THE COUNTS OF MORATA

Headquarters of the Superior Court of Justice of Aragon. It stands out for its cover with two large figures of Hercules and Theseus.

S. XVII. Baroque style church.

44. MUSEUM OF FIRE AND FIREFIGHTERS

Located on what was the cloister and the dependencies of the Convent of the Mínimos de la Victoria (S. XVI). It illustrates the reality of firefighters, yesterday and today.

45. NUESTRA SEÑORA DE GRACIA CHURCH
S. XVII. Baroque style church.

46. COSO DE LA MISERICORDIA (BULLRING)
S. XVIII. Neomudéjar. Second oldest first-class bullfighting arena in Spain.

47. NUESTRA SEÑORA DEL PORTILLO CHURCH

S. XVIII. Aragonese baroque, beautiful decoration made with stucco.



48. IAACC PABLO SERRANO

Example building of Aragonese industrial architecture. It houses the Aragonese Institute of Contemporary Art and Culture and a museum dedicated to Pablo Serrano.

49. CARMEN DOOR

S. XVIII. The only door that remains of the twelve (four Roman and eight medieval) that the defensive wall of Zaragoza once had.

50. UNIVERSITY OF ZARAGOZA/NATURAL SCIENCE MUSEUM

S. XX building made by Ricardo Magdalena. The building shows the evolution of history and life on Earth through its collections.

18. MANTERÍA CHURCH

S. XVII. Greek cross plan church. Its walls and vaults painted by Claudio Coello and Sebastián Muñoz stand out.

19. SÁSTAGO PALACE

S. XVI. Renaissance building. It is currently used as an exhibition hall for the Zaragoza Provincial Council.

20. OUR LADY OF THE PILAR BASILICA - MUSEUM DEVOTED TO OUR LADY OF THE PILAR

A Baroque church and one of the most important centres of pilgrimage of Christendom. It is also an artistic centre of prime importance with artwork of great value from several eras. The frescoes of the vault of the Coreto and the Regina Martyrum dome were painted by Goya.

21. MONTEMUZO PALACE

S. XVI. Aragonese renaissance palace. It houses the municipal archive.



22. GOYA MUSEUM. IBERCAJA COLLECTION. CAMON AZNAR MUSEUM

In the Palacio de los Pardo (S. XVI), it is the only place in the world that permanently exhibits the complete collection of Goya's engravings.

23. LA LONJA (MERCHANTS' HALL)

S. XVI. Used over the last few decades as a municipal exhibition hall. A maximum exponent of civilian Aragonese renaissance architecture.

24. SAN LÁZARO "BALCONY"

One of the most famous photocalls in Zaragoza with spectacular views of Pilar, the stone bridge and the Ebro River.



51. INFANTA COURT

It presents typical features and the structure of Aragonese Renaissance patio.

52. JUNCOSA AND RETUERTA HOUSES
Modern style buildings.

53. MUSEUM OF ETHNOLOGY AND CERAMICS

Located in the Anotana house and the Albarracín house in the Parque Grande.

54. CAIXAFORUM ZARAGOZA

Cultural and social center of "La Caixa" Welfare Projects, it is the work of Carme Pinós Studio.

55. STONE BRIDGE

S. XV. 225 meters long. It is the oldest in Zaragoza that crosses the Ebro River.



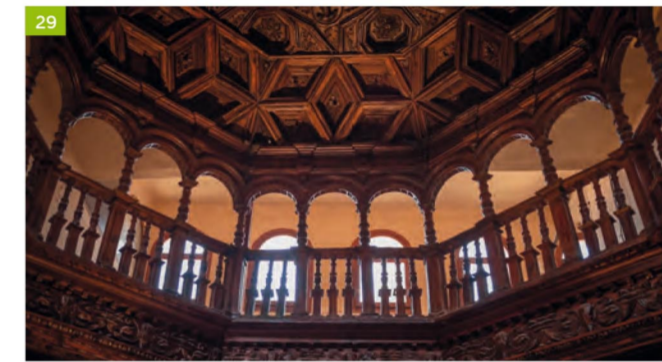
25. CAESARAUGUSTA FORUM MUSEUM

The archaeological remains belong to a market from the era of Emperor Augustus and to the urban forum built in times of his successor, Tiberius.

26. ALMA MATER MUSEUM

Located in the oldest part of the archiepiscopal palace. It offers a valuable collection of sacred art made up of sculptures and paintings, along with other pieces.

27. EL SALVADOR CATHEDRAL (LA SEO) - TAPESTRY MUSEUM
Mudéjar declared a World Heritage Site

An eclectic mix of styles, going from Romanic to Neoclassical. A pinnacle of Mudéjar art of Zaragoza is the outer wall of the parish Chapel of San Miguel Arcangel.

28. CAESARAUGUSTA RIVER PORT MUSEUM

The Ebro river was navigable in Roman times, and an intense trade developed along it.

29. PALACE OF THE REAL MAESTRANZA DE CABALLERÍA

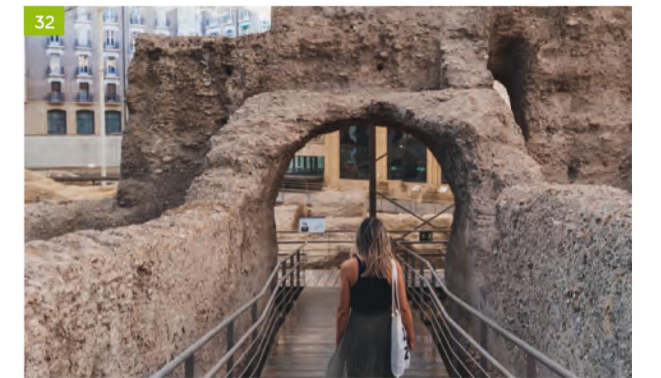
63. EBRO ENVIRONMENTAL CENTER

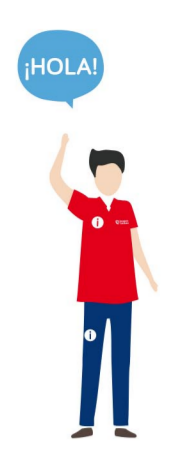
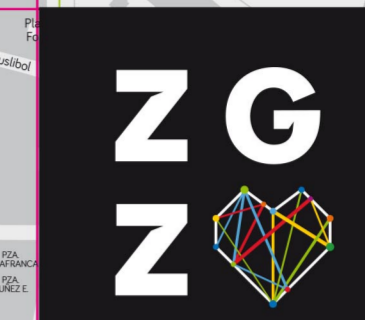
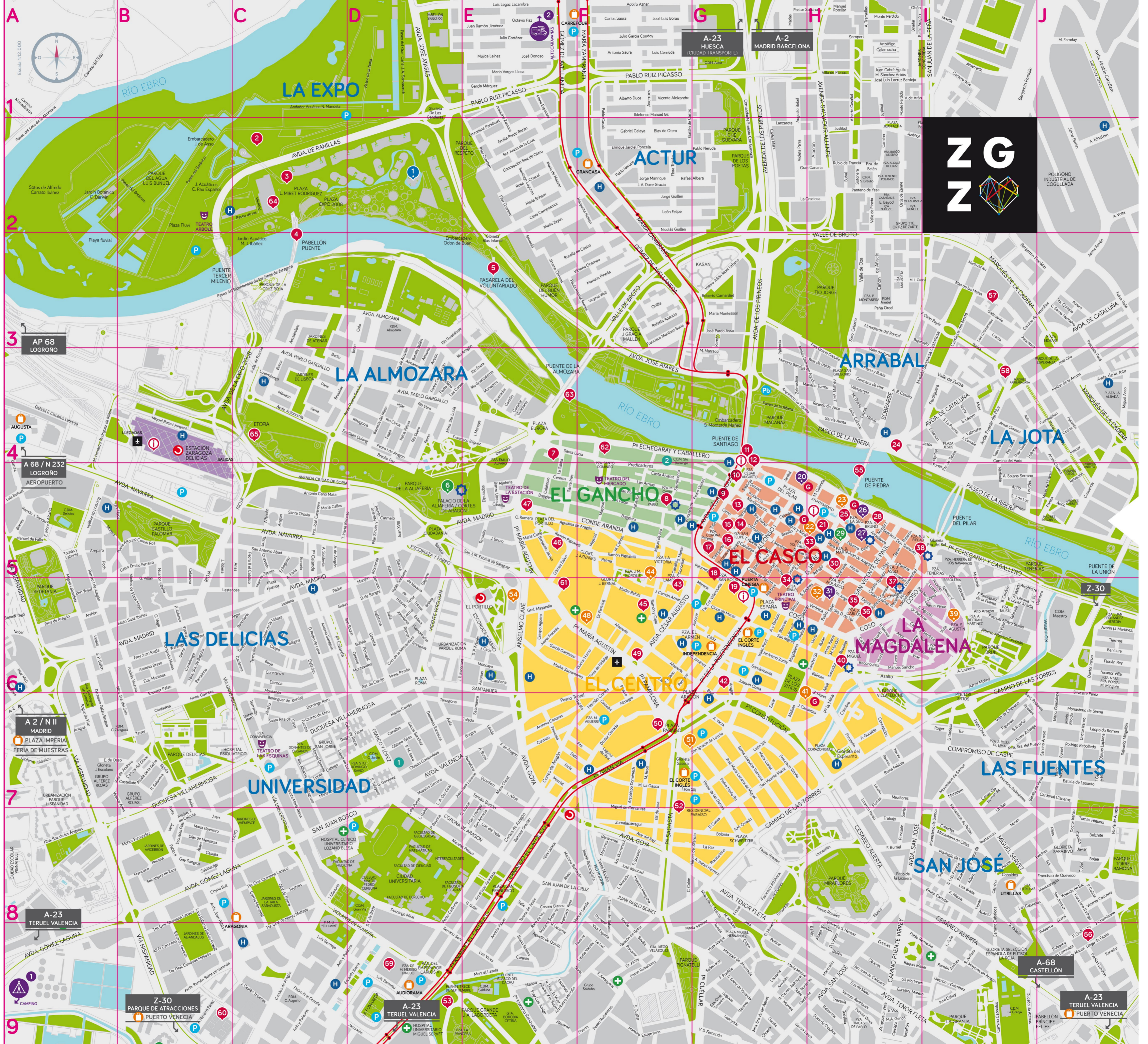
